By incorporating the dates of each meeting on the master sheet, attendance can be easily checked, and only 1 master sheet is required. The master sheet can be copied and attached to your meeting minutes. Prepare the official minutes as soon as possible after your meeting. Provide a copy to your President, and ask her to review the minutes for any needed amendments.

Communications:

2017 is here and we are "off and running"! There is a lot going on in our District and Conference and communications is the way to stay on top of it all. I have received updated officer lists and contact information from 21 of our 60+ local units. To keep you and your unit informed of all activities, action items, and general UMW information, it is important to make sure the district leadership team receives your updated local unit officer and contact information. If you haven't checked the UMW Website recently, I encourage you to do so (www.umw.org). On the homepage

there is a link to an article titled: Let's Box 'Em Up and Stack 'Em up! Super Bowl LI is February5, 2017. This is our UMW annual awareness campaign to symbolize UMW intercepting the traffickers who bind the vulnerable with boxes of imprisonment. We can't prevent all the exploitation of traffickers or their control over the lives of those they traffic, but we can intercept them. Check out the Website and see what your local unit can do to raise awareness of this social action issue.



I also encourage you to monitor our WNCC UMW Website (www.wnccumw.org; you can also link to our Appalachian District UMW Website from here). Our first conference event for 2017 will be Legislative Advocacy Days 2017. Registration for this conference-wide event will open January 17th (register online through the WNCC UMW website). This event will be held at First United Methodist Church in Mocksville on Saturday, April 1st from 9:30am - 3:30pm. The theme is taken from 1 Cor. 1:27 – "The foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom...God uses the foolish to shame the wise."

After a brief opening, speakers will provide overviews of the four Social Action priorities for this quadrennium.

- Climate Justice
- Maternal/Child Health
- Criminalization of Communities of Color/Mass Incarceration
- Economic Inequality

Participants are asked to bring a bag lunch. Drinks and snacks will be provided. There is no cost to attend our Legislative Advocacy Day.

Greetings to Local Unit Treasurers!

I look forward to working with all of you in 2017 and welcome those who are new to the treasurer's position this year. Remember that you have two important responsibilities in performing the Treasurer's job.


The first and most obvious responsibility is the financial responsibility that includes following best practices for safeguarding the money, making deposits and payments from the UMW checking account, recording receipts and disbursements, reporting the financial activity of the local unit to your members, and remitting pledge and other funds to the District UMW Treasurer at the end of each mission quarter. All checks sent to me should be made out to *Appalachian* (or *App*) *District UMW Treasurer*. Please send all checks with a Remittance Form except for event registrations. Remittance Forms can be found on the UMW Website, or I can send you a copy if you are not able to print from the website.

Second, and just as important as financial recordkeeping, is the responsibility of lifting up the purpose of UMW to your local unit. As Treasurer, you can remind the unit about where our mission dollars go throughout the year and how UMW reaches around the world with our mission dollars. We are in the business of Empowering Women throughout the world.

Please remember that we keep strict confidentiality about each member's giving and we never pressure anyone who may not make her pledge. Let's encourage members to stretch a little and exceed their pledges whenever possible. Even the smallest additional amount adds up to a significant amount when we pool our giving.

As always, I will mail to the Local Unit Treasurer a letter at the first of the month before the end of the mission quarter. Letters go out February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1. These letters provide a lot of information to you, especially if you are learning the job of treasurer. 

Directions to Wilkesboro United Methodist Church

From Boone and West Wilkes Co. - Take US-421 South to NC-268 (Exit 286B) toward Wilkesboro/Downtown. Turn left on NC-268 and in approximately 1.2 miles arrive at church on your right.

From I-77 (Statesville) - Take I-77 to Exit 73B onto US-421 North toward Wilkesboro/Boone. On US-421, go approximately 20 miles to Exit 286A (NC16/18 toward Wilkesboro/Taylorsville/Lenoir); keep left at the fork on the exit ramp and turn left onto NC-18N (Cherry St.). Go approximately ½ mile to the traffic light and turn right onto W. Main St. In approximately ¼ mile, arrive at church on your right.

From Taylors ville - Take NC-16N toward Wilkesboro (approx. 18 miles); Turn right on West Main Street; church is approx. 1/4 mile on your right.

From Lenoir - Take NC-18N/Wilkesboro Rd approximately 23 miles; take a right onto NC-16N/NC-18N. In 3.8 miles, turn right onto N. Main Street In approximately 1/4 mile, arrive at church on your right.

From Sparta - Take NC-18S. In approx. 35.5 miles, turn left on 5th Street, then right onto Cherry St. In .2 miles, keep left to continue on Wilkesbor Ave; in 3/4 mile, turn right onto Hwy 268/Main Street. In approx. 3/4 mile, passing the Federal Bldg, on the left, at the traffic light (Woodland Blvd), turn left and then right into the church parking lot.

Plan 1-5 books per year


Plan 2 - 10 books per year


