I look forward to serving in my new position as your MEI coordinator for the Appalachian District. Let us invite our younger ladies to come onboard.



Directions to Wilkesboro United Methodist Church

From Boone and West Wilkes Co. - Take US-421 South to NC-268 (Exit 286B) toward Wilkesboro/Downtown. Turn left on NC-268 and in approximately 1.2 miles arrive at church on your right.

From I-77 (Statesville) - Take I-77 to Exit 73B onto US-421 North toward Wilkesboro/Boone. On US-421, go approximately 20 miles to Exit 286A (NC16/18 toward Wilkesboro/Taylorsville/Lenoir); keep left at the fork on the exit ramp and turn left onto NC-18N (Cherry St.). Go approximately ½ mile to the traffic light and turn right onto W. Main St. In approximately ¼ mile, arrive at church on your right.

From Taylors ville - Take NC-16N toward Wilkesboro (approx. 18 miles); Turn right on West Main Street; church is approx. 1/4 mile on your right.

From Lenoir - Take NC-18N/Wilkesboro Rd approximately 23 miles; take a right onto NC-16N/NC-18N. In 3.8 miles, turn right onto N. Main Street In approximately 1/4 mile, arrive at church on your right.

From Sparta - Take NC-18S. In approx. 35.5 miles, turn left on 5th Street, then right onto Cherry St. In .2 miles, keep left to continue on Wilkesbor Ave; in 3/4 mile, turn right onto Hwy 268/Main Street. In approx. 3/4 mile, passing the Federal Bldg, on the left, at the traffic light (Woodland Blvd), turn left and then right into the church parking lot.

Social Action:

Greetings, My Fellow UMW!

The United Methodist Women's national office has made climate justice one of its four social justice priorities (along with the deep intersectional injustices between gender, racial, and economic injustice). As Earth Day approaches (April 22nd) keep our climate justice theme in mind..."Be Just. Be Green.".



"The changes in temperatures, from the unusual cold in the American Northeast to the blazing temperatures in the Southwest, to the droughts, fires and floods across the country and around the world, affect some more than others. As we continue to explore this important issue, we want everyone to be aware of the ways policy and laws have created a multiplicity of environmental pressures on some "sacrificed" communities. At the same time, those in more environmentally balanced areas — although at times also affected by storms and environmental problems — live on relatively unaffected. Power plants, manufacturing, mining, waste incinerators and waste dumps, railroad lines, seaports, sewage treatment plants and trucking routes magnify the concerns during an extreme weather event for the most economically vulnerable. The factors that cause greenhouse gases (the key contributor to human-caused climate change) can also lead to asthma, cancer, immune system disorders, hormonal imbalances, and ultimately displacement, impoverishment and migration."

United Methodist Book of Discipline:

All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings. God has granted us stewardship of creation. We should meet these stewardship duties through acts of loving care and respect. (Social Principles, ¶ 160)

SPECIAL NEEDS: If you have any physical conditions that require consideration in room or classroom assignment, please explain on registration form or on a separate sheet of paper stapled to your form.

Child care is not available.

REFUNDS: There will be no refunds without at least 7 days' notice. (\$50.00 of Resident Fee is not refundable.) **HOUSING**: Bring bed linens (including blanket and pillow), towels, clothes hangers, toiletries, bathrobe, and any other items you feel necessary for your comfort away from home. (Wireless internet is available all over campus.)

CLASSES: Full-Time students take two studies: Living as a Covenant Community and **either** Missionary Conferences **or** Climate Justice.
