- Project AGAPE is in need of the following items: kitchen supplies, bedding, children's clothing (new or clean, gently used), hygiene products, new shoes, towels and wash cloths. Go to <https://www.wnccumc.org/project-agape> to learn about pick up/drop off times and locations. You may bring these dona-tions as well as UMCOR donations to the Mission Response Center if you plan to come to UBUNTU Day October 29, or to our Membership and Leadership Development Day on November 5.
- UMCOR has put together information for a New Menstrual Hygiene Kit, aka "Period Pack" which includes the following: one bar of soap, hand sanitizer, travel wet wipes, travel pack of flushable wipes, laundry detergent packs, 10 tampons, 10 sanitary napkins and trash bags. - When you make kits for UMCOR, don't forget the donations for shipping. Hygiene Kits and Menstrual Kits require \$2.00 each. Make checks to UMW and give them to your Local Unit Treasurer who will forward the funds to our Dis-tribut Treasurer, Nancy Johnson.
- Continue working towards being a Mission Today unit. The criteria is the same as for 2021 except # 26 which now reads: "The 2022 Conference Financial Goal is: Each unit will meet or exceed its pre-pandemic Mission Giving."
- The Union Grove UMC Veterans/Community Market was the Hands On Mission Project for the Appalachian District Annual Celebration. Approximately 15 boxes of cereal, 43 jars of peanut butter, some soups and honeybuns were donated for food distribution to assist families in the community.

Hands on Mission: UMCOR Hygiene Kits (see material and kit instructions below)

Kit Materials: One hand towel (15 x 25 – 17 x 27 inches; no kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber); **one washcloth** (no kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber); **one comb** (sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth; no pocket combs or picks); **one toenail or fingernail clipper** (no emery boards or metal nail files); **bath-size soap** (3oz bar or larger; no Ivory or Jergen’s soap; do not remove packaging); **one adult toothbrush** (leave in packaging; personal advertising not acceptable); **10 adhesive bandages** (3/4 by 3”); **One one-gallon size re-sealable bag.**

NOTE: Contents or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols; all items must be new and not washed; No personal notes, money, or additional materials. Please send a check or cash for \$2 per kit to cover the cost of toothpaste and shipping to our Appalachian District Treasurer. Go to www.umcor.org for additional information.

You may also bring the new UMCOR “Period Packs” as well as Project Agape in Armenia items (kitchen supplies, bedding, children’s clothing (new or clean, gently used), hygiene products, new shoes, towels and wash cloths)

Directions:

From Boone, Lenoir and West: Take US-221 S/US-321 S to Granite Falls. Turn right on N. Highland Ave.; in 1 mile, turn left onto N. Main Street, then right onto Park Ave, left onto Elgin St; arrive at First Granite Falls on the left.

From Wilkesboro, Sparta and North: Take NC-18 S to Lenoir; turn left onto US-321/Hickory Blvd. In 8.7 miles, turn right onto Highland Ave., in 1 mile, turn left onto N. Main Street, then right onto Park Ave, left onto Elgin St; arrive at First Granite Falls on the left.

From Statesville and South: Take I-40 W toward Hickory; Take exit 123-123A-123B for US-321 N toward Hickory/Lenoir/US-70; keep right at fork continuing on Exit 123B. Merge onto US-321 N; in 7.1 miles, take the exit toward Granite Falls/Downtown; in .1miles, turn left onto Falls Ave., in .5 miles turn right onto S. Main St.; in .2 miles, turn left onto Lakeside Ave., then right onto Elgin St.; arrive at First Granite Falls on right.

From Taylorsville area: Take US-64 W. to (turn left) NC-127 S; in 3.6 miles, turn right onto Antioch Church Rd. In 11 miles; make a sharp right onto S. Main St. In .2 miles, turn left onto Lakeside Ave., then right onto Elgin St.; arrive at First Granite Falls on right

We kicked off our Unit Accomplishment Celebration with a short video from the UWF National Office. We celebrated the local units for 2021 mission accomplishments: fourteen Mission Today units (eleven Gold units and three Silver units), Nine Mission Study units; Nine Justice Today units (three Gold, two Silver, and four Bronze); two Membership Units (added at least one new member in 2021); and fourteen Five Channels of Mission Giving Units. Certificates were provided for units in attendance and unit names for each accomplishment are listed in the program book. We paused for a moment of silence while remembering the thirty-six United Methodist Women who passed away in 2021; these names are listed in the program book. We, the Appalachian District of United Women in Faith are now in our fourth quarter of Mission Giving.

So, how are we doing? At the end of the third quarter, we have submitted \$18,434.25 toward our Pledge to Missions of \$48,000 for 2022. All funds MUST be submitted for Pledge to Missions by November 30, 2022 so they can be submitted to the Conference Treasurer. Do not forget, we support programs in the United States and around the world that benefit women, children, and youth. I have had the opportunity and blessing of seeing faith and love in action supported by United Methodist Women/United Women in Faith in the United States as well as in Zimbabwe, Liberia, Kenya and Cambodia. Your giving makes a difference, your giving MATTERS.

Nancy Reigel, our Conference Treasurer wrote in the Conference Gram, September 2022, "We need to look at who we are and where we are going-together. That is what those torchbearers 153 years ago did: they had a vision focused on the needs of women in India. They shared their compelling story without phones or the Internet! By doing so, they raised the money to put faith into action. When we have a compelling vision and credibility with donors, the funds will follow. . .with joy."



Mt Bethel UWF Thrift Store



In 2018, the Mt. Bethel UMW stepped out in faith as we opened a thrift store in the Bethlehem Community - - - New Life Thrift Store. We had no idea how the Community would react to a thrift store; but react, they did! In less than two months, we found we had run out of space in our first location. In early 2019 , we moved to our current location which is four times larger than our first location. Now we have a drop box for donations, a larger sorting area, and it is located right across the street from our church.

This endeavor supports mission. Since opening, we have been able to give over \$15,000 to the following: Bethlehem Ministeral Association, the Library, schools- including the ele-mentary schools in Bethlehem and Wittenburg, the Middle School and the High School, Rotary Backpack Program, Caring Hearts Pregnancy Center, the Food Pantry, our Youth, our CDC Staff, school supplies for the beginning of school and others.

Since this is a mission project, we keep the prices in our store low! All of the workers volunteer their time two to three times a month for three hour shifts. Our volunteers come from our UMW (now UWF) and from the community. We are also lucky to have three faithful men to help us sort, carry and clean weekly.

So if you are in the Bethlehem Community, just drop in. We just might have something you did not know you needed! We are open Tuesday and Saturday from 10-4 and on Thursday from 12-6 . Come visit us at:

New Life Thrift Store




We are all part of God's story! The 2022-23 Program Resource shows how we can answer our calling today as women of passion committed to helping women, children, and youth.
